

## **RIX-Yasui Scholarship for Overseas Study**

### **Q&A**

#### **<Regarding Scholarship Eligibility>**

Q1. I participated in a short-term program departing in March and returning in April. Can I receive the scholarship in this case?

- A. This scholarship is limited to for programs that both begin and end between April 1 and March 31 of the following year. Therefore, in this case, the program does not fall within the eligible period, and you cannot receive the scholarship.

#### **<Regarding Required Documents>**

Q2. I use a bank account that does not have a passbook, so I cannot submit a copy of the passbook.

- A. In this case, a screenshot showing the bank name, branch name, account number, and account holder's Name, as listed in Form 1 (Consent for Bank Transfer of Salary, etc.) is acceptable.

Q3. I am a first-year undergraduate student and cannot obtain an academic transcript.

- A. In the application form, please enter "Unable to obtain an academic transcript as I am a first-year undergraduate student" in the field for entering your most recent GPA at the time of application.

#### **<Regarding Duplicate/Overlapping Funding >**

Q4. I expect to receive an external study abroad scholarship. Can I receive both scholarships concurrently?

- A. Some scholarships cannot be received concurrently. Please carefully review the guidelines for the other scholarship.

Within Kyushu University, only scholarships independently offered by your faculty or graduate school may be received concurrently. Concurrent receipt with the Kyushu University Fund Support Program" Study Abroad Support Program" (for both undergraduate and graduate students Short-Term Study Abroad Support) is not permitted.

Q5. Before traveling overseas, I participated in the program online, and later I travelled abroad to join the same program in person. Can I receive both the ¥80,000 (in-person dispatch) and the ¥20,000 (online)?

A. You can only receive one of them. Please select and enter only one option in the application form.
